PAKISTAN AND ROYAL SAUDI AIR FORCES CONDUCT JOINT EXERCISE “AL SAQOOR-II”

ISLAMABAD 16 JANUARY, 2010:- PAF and RSAF (Royal Saudi Air Force) are conducting a joint air power employment exercise code name “Al Saqoor-II” in Saudi Arabia. The joint exercise commenced on 06 January and is planned to be completed by 19 January, 2011. PAF contingent comprises F-16 and Mirage aircraft, while RSAF element consists of F-15 aircraft are participating in the exercise in which air operations are being executed in near realistic environment. The exercise will benefit both participants and hone their professional skills and further enhance existing brotherly relations between the two nations and their Air Forces.
